## Fauntleroy Community Association Minutes February 12, 2013

The meeting was called to order by President Bruce Butterfield at 7:04. In attendance were FCA board members; Gary Dawson, Trileigh Tucker, Caroline Duncan, Vlad Oustimovitch, Kathleen Dellplain, David Haggerty, Gordon Wiehler, Phil Sweetland, and Martin Westerman. Also in attendance were; Kristine Cramer of King County Wastewater, Denise Dahn, Cass Nevada of Alliance for Lincoln Park, Tracy Record of WSB, James Day and Jim Nuerenberg, residents. The minutes were accepted as written.

Kristine Cramer gave us an update on the Barton Street Substation. The Japanese crew doing the Jack Grouting is nearly finished. The bypass on the pump station will start soon. That will require 24 hour a day work with pumps and generators going full time. A box may be built around the generator for noise control. The completed station will be waterproof in case of sea level rise or storms. The CSO rain garden construction will begin in 2014. Rainwise rebates will be available for residents to add rain gardens or cisterns. There will be no new art for the Barton Station.

Trileigh Tucker introduced members of the Alliance for Lincoln Park, Denise Dahn, and Cass Nevada. Denise talked about the erosion of the paths and forest of Lincoln Park. There are arrows all over from various races and events. The maintenance area is growing; Lincoln Park is a hub for SW region parks maintenance.

Celebrate Lincoln Park will be Tuesday April 23<sup>rd</sup>. This will be an Open House concept at the Hall at Fauntleroy. Carolyn will notify members of her committee for planning and organizing.

Street trees – Claudia Levi is arranging for street trees along the east side of Fauntleroy Way, north of Lincoln Park. They will start north of Cloverdale or Thistle to not block water views. There may also be street trees on the west side of Fauntleroy Way.

The Fauntleroy Food Fest will be March 19<sup>th</sup>. Eight Vendors have accepted. Community tables are set; assignments will be made at the March meeting. Remember to mingle!

Carolyn and Gordon went over the survey results. There were 177 responses so far. Most responders are over 50, and generally happy here. The survey will run a little longer.

The treasury report was sent via email.

Bruce Butterfield is retiring as president of the FCA. If there are no other candidates, David Haggerty will serve as president for 2013. All board members are urged to encourage new FCA participants.
