**Minutes:** Minutes were amended, passed with changes

**WS Police Report: Lt Ebinger**

- YTD, burglary is down in precinct; motor vehicle crime up 2%
- All stats are available on SPD dashboard -

- Staffing reductions are less in WS than other precincts, ½ leaving Department, ½ retiring, at present 70 – 80 officers in precinct
- Regarding homeless issue, City Hall is driver of policy
- Morale in precinct is good

**Fall Festival: Reed Haggerty**

- Santa pictures are planned for December with Gayle Ann Photography
- Looking for ways to support local businesses
- Reach out to business partners (BP's) to see how can help them
- Highlight stopping in or by BP's via social media posts
- Develop virtual Community chalkboard, hashtag link, develop conversation

- City Grant for the Fall Festival, while able to apply not sure if money will be available in 2021
- Plan to focus marketing materials on why, event it was created, share story - Covid similar to 9/11 in impact
- Fall Festival Committee is making a specific ask to FCA for additional support
- Will check in earlier with vendor to develop budget earlier, will keep FCA in the loop
- Reed will draft article discussing the importance and impact of Fall Festival to Community for inclusion in Newsletter

#### **Ferry Update:**

- Several elected officials on Transportation Committees requested a meeting with FAC Executive Committee to discuss position on financial and operational challenges faced by WSF
- WSF has set up public outreach meeting for December 3<sup>rd</sup> to discuss Fauntleroy Dock project

#### **New Neighbor Mailing Update:**

- 100 mailings were sent out to new residents that have moved into area
- Formal ‘bags’ – can distribute as requested – some supplies are on hand, need additional materials – goodies, give away items, coupons from local businesses

#### **Pumpkin Review:**

- Received several photos that were posted on social media
- Manageable size and duration, over 5 days
- Looking forward to doing again next year

#### **Survey Update:**

- Up and running, please fill out and encourage others to
- 3,000 postcards were sent out to all addresses in catchment area

- Cost for printing and postage approximately \$1,500

#### **Membership Renewal Date:**

- The Dec 2019 newsletter announced the new 12/31 expiration date
- However renewal notices for 2020 were still sent in March of 2020
- For 2021, renewal requests will be sent in December 2020
- We don’t have the ability to prorate membership months, so when NEW members join between July and December, we give those months free and apply the payment to the next year.
