

**Fauntleroy Community Association  
Business Meeting Minutes  
November 11, 2025  
Fauntleroy Schoolhouse**

**Call to Order, Welcome & Introductions:** Frank Immel, president, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m.

**October 14 Meeting Minutes:** The minutes from the October 14 meeting were approved.

**SW Precinct SPD Update:** No one was present from the precinct so there was no update.

**Crossing Flags:** Bill is now taking responsibility for the crossing flags in the area and noted that he replenished flags at several locations recently. Frank noted that he has zip ties, if needed, to better secure the crossing flag containers to their posts. Susan asked that Bill map out all the crossing flag locations for her review to ensure we're capturing all of the locations that Mike established.

**Rose Street Bus Stop/Crossing:** Catherine noted that she has attempted to follow up with Ching Chan who presented SDOT's proposal for the revised street modification and crossing signal at Fauntleroy Way SW and SW Rose Street during our October meeting. There is currently no new information to share; however, she will continue to follow-up with Ching so that our many questions/issues can be addressed.

**Culvert Communication/Update:** There is no new information to report regarding communication plans or the work itself; however, information was provided within the last few weeks for those associated with Fauntleroy United Church of Christ. Frank will ask Judy Pickens for the project contact person at SPU so that we can provide input to them.

**Financial Update:** Alan presented an update noting a positive financial status for FCA due in large part to donations received for the Fall Festival. We are \$640 away from breaking even with the FF. He also noted that we need to pay a subscription fee of \$2,025 to Wild Apricot, our membership software, in December. The fee is 3% higher if we do not pay them via ACH (direct) bank payment. The ACH payment is not currently set up for them; however, Catherine offered to do that since she has banking authorization. Meredith, via email, also noted that we need to remove Mike's name as administrator on the software account so Catherine will take care of that as well.

**FCA Survey:** As mentioned at the October meeting, we will work with Bill's Marketing/Communication committee to determine when and how to conduct the next neighborhood survey. There's a desire to find ways to save money compared to what we paid for the previous survey and yet also reach as many people as possible. We also want response rates to increase. It was suggested that we use the Annual Meeting & Food Fest to solicit input for survey topics. Ideas also include the need to capture more email addresses, develop posters to ask for input and determine survey topics.

**Ferry Update:** Frank noted that the final CAG meeting was three weeks ago. Mardi stated that we are now in the "PEL phase" of WSDOT's project work and that the Environmental Impact Study will start soon. She reminded the group that the final project options are B and B3, both of which include a longer dock and one that is a bit wider. Their goal is to accommodate 124-155 cars while the current dock holds 80 vehicles. WSDOT has stated that overhead loading for passengers and a second slip is not part of this project. \$90 million was allocated by the legislature 10 years ago for the project and the sentiment is that this is not nearly enough money in today's environment. Construction logistics, a temporary dock and its placement as well as bike lane and traffic light placement were also mentioned.

#### Open Discussion:

- Parking issues. Do not use the "Find It, Fix It" app any more for neighborhood parking problems. Instead, call the SPD non-emergency phone #.
- Jamison is considering offering a discount on his photography services for FCA members.
- Bill will schedule another meeting of the Marketing/Communications committee. At the previous meeting, there was agreement that the Fauntleroy Flash would only be used for "super emergent" (e.g., no more than once per month) topics and that we would do a quarterly email to FCA members on more general but relevant news topics.
- It was noted that with the start of the school year, parents who are picking up their kids who attend school on Vashon are not always complying with street parking regulations or general courtesy of those in the neighborhood. Can we communicate to them through the school district?
- Anyone writing an article for Judy for the December issue of Neighbors should get their piece to her by this Thursday.
- Mardi reported that two pieces of art (ravens) were damaged at Cove Park recently. Frank noted that he will reach out to Amy Chen at 4Culture/1% for Art regarding replacement.
- It was noted that there are new "No right turn on red" signs at popular intersections in the neighborhood (e.g., 35<sup>th</sup> SW and SW Barton St.) so please be aware.

With no more discussion, Frank adjourned the meeting at 7:40 p.m.
