

Fauntleroy Community Association Minutes

July 9, 2013

The meeting was called to order at 7:05 by President, David Haggerty. In attendance were board members; Carolyn Duncan, Gary Dawson, Phil Sweetland, Trileigh Tucker, Gordon Wiehler, Mike Dey, Vlad Oustimovitch, and Kathleen Dellplain. Also in attendance was Sheila Nishimoto.

Trileigh reported on the Parks meeting. The meeting was mainly about the upcoming Parks Levy. There was some discussion about wildlife in the park and the future of Seattle parks. She also had some communication with Sally Bagshaw's representatives. We are still waiting for communication from Regional Parks strategic outreach whose mission is to manage relationships with surrounding communities.

Sheila Nishimoto and Gordon Wiehler have been monitoring the motorcycle speed and noise each morning starting at 5:00am. Some bikes are as loud as 110 decibels. She has written to the Mayor. It was suggested Gordon also make a video.

Gary Dawson has been in communication with SDOT and the City Council about Cars2go. They will do another study about the number of cars, their length on the street, and the turnover of Cars2go in the RPZ.

The membership subcommittee will be meeting to discuss lifetime memberships, members in general and proposals to increase membership and renewals.

The project to remove invasive weeds in Fauntleroy Ravine has hit a snag. Permits are required to allow Earth Core to work on SDOT and some private property in the ravine.

September 24th at 6:30 has been set for the community Police meeting and ice cream social. David will work on the facility; Mike will draft an outline for the meeting. Block watch sign-ups will be encouraged. Neighborhood night out is August 6th.

Survey follow-up will be sent by email to the Board and to Judy Pickens for inclusion in the newsletter. The deadline for the newsletter is August 15th.

Director Mosley of Washington State Ferries talked to the State Legislature about the need for a 10 cent per gallon gas tax to support the ferries. Gary Dawson expects the new 144 car ferry to start on the Fauntleroy triangle run next year.

Treasury Report – The treasury is on budget. No unexpected expenses so far this year. Membership renewals are slowing.
